Hornbrook School District

(Also See Cottonwood)

The original Hornbrook School was located in Henley and was called the Cottonwood School. When the railroad was built, the town of Hornbrook flourished. The Cottonwood School was abandoned and a new school named Hornbrook was started. The name Cottonwood was changed to Hornbrook in 1924.

The old original town was called Cottonwood. Later, a colonel T.J. Henley, commandant of troops to control the marauding of Indians in the area, had the honor of having the renamed Henley after himself.

The district was named after Mr. David Horn, who donated the property from part of his ranch. The school was located at the present site in Hornbrook. This school burned in 1936 and a new school was built on the same site.

Established: September 2, 1924 – Cottonwood School District name changed to Hornbrook School District (13-276)

August 3, 1937 – Part of Klamath School District added to Hornbrook (18-337) January 29, 1957 – Bond bids and selling of bonds (24-487)


